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PURPOSE

Describe Launch: Nursing Academic Readiness program and procedure for completion.

SCOPE

All incoming second year students enrolled at LVH-S Joseph F. McCloskey School of Nursing.

POLICY

Launch: Nursing Academic Readiness is a requirement of progression into the second year of LVH-S Joseph F. McCloskey School of Nursing. Students must complete all components of the Launch: Nursing Academic Readiness program and submit the Launch Certificate to the Student Success Specialist by the deadline to move forward in the program.

PROCEDURE

All incoming 2nd year (junior) students will be enrolled in Launch: Nursing Academic Readiness and will be required to complete all components of the review.

- Successful engagement in Launch: Nursing Academic Readiness includes Completion of the following:
 - 5 content modules
 - Each content module includes steps for the student to prepare, assess, and improve in the review. The ATI Educator will assign additional resources to support the student’s success.
 - Student must complete all activities assigned by their ATI Educator to receive their certificate of completion.

School faculty have access to students’ progress in Launch: Nursing Academic Readiness. Student progress will include completion of the content modules and all educator assigned activities.

Launch: Nursing Academic Readiness will be administered as a 6-week access program. Students should demonstrate active engagement in the review each week.

Launch: Nursing Academic Readiness Process

To begin the review:

- Students will receive an email to the address listed on their ATI profile with a survey to complete.
- Student will be enrolled into the review within 24 hours (Monday through Friday, except major holiday breaks) of completing the survey.
- Student will receive a welcome email upon enrollment providing directions to access the review on atitesting.com using their ATI username and password and clicking the launch card under the Learn tab.

Students should log into the review:

- Complete the Orientation module and download Review Checklist

Successful engagement in Launch: Nursing Academic Readiness includes completion of the following:

- 5 Content Modules
- Each content module includes steps for the student to prepare, assess, and improve in the review. The ATI Educator will assign additional resources to support the student’s success.
- Students must complete all activities assigned by their ATI Educator to receive their certificate of completion.

School faculty have access to students’ progress in Launch: Nursing Academic Readiness. Student progress will include completion of the Content Modules and all educator assigned activities. Institutions will award up to the total points listed below upon completion.
